The Trees of Hope project, coordinated by the Clinton Development Initiative and certified under the Plan Vivo Standard is a community-based improved land management project, which addresses crucial issues of land degradation, unemployment, and food security, which threaten the livelihoods of local communities in Neno and Dowa districts of Malawi, while also contributing to global efforts to tackle climate change.



he project taps into the voluntary carbon markets for finance, and brings together community members to develop agroforestry systems, which are designed to improve soils, provide a future source of wood products, as well as planting fruit orchards and trees with crops to diversify farmers' incomes.
